Question	Recommended Answer
<b>Who is my child's tutor?</b>	Your child will be matched with a personal reading tutor, and their tutoring sessions will occur for 15 minutes daily over computer video at a time during school that minimizes disruptions to their regular schedule. All Ignite Reading tutors are background checked, highly trained in the Science of Reading, and have completed over 100 hours of professional learning.
<b>How long will my child receive tutoring this year?</b>	Students will continue to receive tutoring this year until they demonstrate mastery of all foundational skills, while maintaining an average attendance rate of 80%.
<b>Can my child log into Ignite from home?</b>	Ignite Reading happens during the school day but if we anticipate a student will have a long-term absence, we can work with the Ignite Reading team to find an at home solution.  When school is closed, Ignite Reading tutoring is not available.
<b>How often will I receive data or updates on my child's progress?</b>	School teams meet monthly with Ignite Reading Literacy Specialists to discuss school wide and student level data.  Ignite Reading provides parents reports at the beginning and end of the program to share where students will start their instruction and how far they have progressed.
<b>How can I select the appropriate text that aligns to my child's Ignite protocol?</b>	On the Tutoring Progress Report, there is a QR code that will take you to a Parent Resource that will have recommended words for practice and texts that align to the skills your students are working on.
<b>What do the assessments look like</b>	Assessments given in the Ignite Reading program test on mastery of reading words at varying levels of difficulty and reading passages with a

<b>that my child will be taking in the Ignite program?</b>	variety of words. These assessments are not independent and are administered by their tutor.
<b>How does Ignite Reading align to what is being taught in my child's class?</b>	<p>Students in Kindergarten - Grade 2: This instruction aligns directly to the grade-level foundational skills instruction. This extra support will guarantee your student reaches and/or maintains grade level mastery.</p> <p>Students above Grade 3+: This instruction will target instructional gaps that are currently impacting your student's mastery on grade level content. This tutoring instruction will allow for your student to have strong independent practice when engaging in texts independently.</p>
<b>What happens during the tutoring session? / What is my child learning?</b>	Your Tutoring Progress Report and the Progress Report resource will share more about the Foundational Skills instruction and the pattern or word type your student is receiving instruction on.
<b>What happens if my child misses a session?</b>	If your child misses a session, they can return to their session the next day. If your student needs to miss multiple sessions, please let your child's teacher know.
<b>How can I reinforce what the tutor is doing outside of sessions?</b>	On your tutoring progress report, you will see a QR code that will take you to a resource that has details on the skills, words, and types of texts your students should review to reinforce their tutoring instruction.
<b>My student has accommodations, are they being used during tutoring as well?</b>	Yes! Our school team shares details about applicable accommodations with the Ignite Reading team. These accommodations will be honored during each tutoring session.
