<p>Classroom Management: <i>How do I manage the workbook resource?</i></p>	<p>Keep workbooks in a designated area where students can easily access them during transition times. Having a clear system for distribution and collection helps maintain organization and student independence.</p>										
<p>Differentiation: <i>How do I use the student workbook to meet the varying needs of my students?</i></p>	<p>Some students may need more support initially. <i>Consider:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Pairing students working in the same protocol ● Using highlighters to make word patterns more visible ● Creating a sound card reference sheet for tricky graphemes 	<p>Read each word. 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<p>Creative Implementation: <i>What are some other creative ways I can use the workbooks in my classroom?</i></p>	<p>'Be an Ignite Tutor' approach. Students love taking on the role of the teacher! Pair students working in the same protocol. <i>Students can:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Use the same positive language their tutors use ● Give specific praise to their partners ● Track sounds with their pencil just like their tutors do 										
<p>Maximizing Engagement: <i>How do I ensure my students are engaged?</i></p>	<p>Keep the energy high by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Celebrating progress with simple check marks or stamps ● Setting up 'Reading Celebrations' where students share ● Posting stellar student work in the classroom or hallways 	<p>Draw a picture to match the sentences.</p> 									
<p>Common Challenges and Solutions: <i>What are some common challenges and what are your ideas on how to best respond?</i></p>	<p>If students rush through activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Model and implement a 'Check and Reflect' routine ● Read to peer/adult; listener signs their name to verify completion <p>If students struggle with independence:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Use the visual supports on each page ● Create a simple 'What to Do If I Need Help' chart ● Partner students strategically <p>For students who need more support:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Break activities into smaller chunks ● Provide additional multisensory supports <p>Managing volume</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Create classroom norms for appropriate voice levels 	<p>Read each line.</p>
